Riva is Italian for *shore*, for the gentle waves in the patterned sections and the slight overlappings and curled edges throughout.

The scarf is worked back and forth lengthwise on long circular needles. The pattern is highly customizable (see Design Notes) and a good project to use up small quantities of lightweight yarn.

DIMENSIONS 43 3/4" x 7" (111 cm x 18 cm)

GAUGE 16 sts & 22 rows = 2'' (5 cm) in stockinette stitch.

Gauge is not critical, but swatching will help you choose the needle size and gauge that

give you the best fabric for your chosen yarn — not too loose, not too tight.

YARN Holst Garn Supersoft, 100% wool, approx. 627 yards (575 meters) per 100 grams, WPI 14.

Colors: Silver Grey (A), Flannel Grey (B), Slate Grey (C), Graphite (D), Calypso (E).

OR comparable yarn in 5 solid or heather colors.

NOTE: Please chose a yarn that responds well to blocking, as the construction makes the

scarf prone to curling.

YARN QUANTITY approx. 500 yards (460 meters) = 80 grams:

25 g of color A, 30 g each of colors B and C, 5 g of color D, a few yards of color E.

NEEDLES Two 32" (80 cm) circular needles in size US 0 (2 mm) or size for you to obtain gauge.

NOTIONS Tapestry needle

Six stitch markers T-pins for blocking

TECHNIQUES Long-tail cast-on

3-needle join Blocking

Stitches used: k, p, ssk, k2tog, M1L, RLI.

Portuguese or Turkish purling (a suggestion for knitters who dislike purling)
